It is hard for my teacher to hear if we all talk at once. It becomes too noisy.

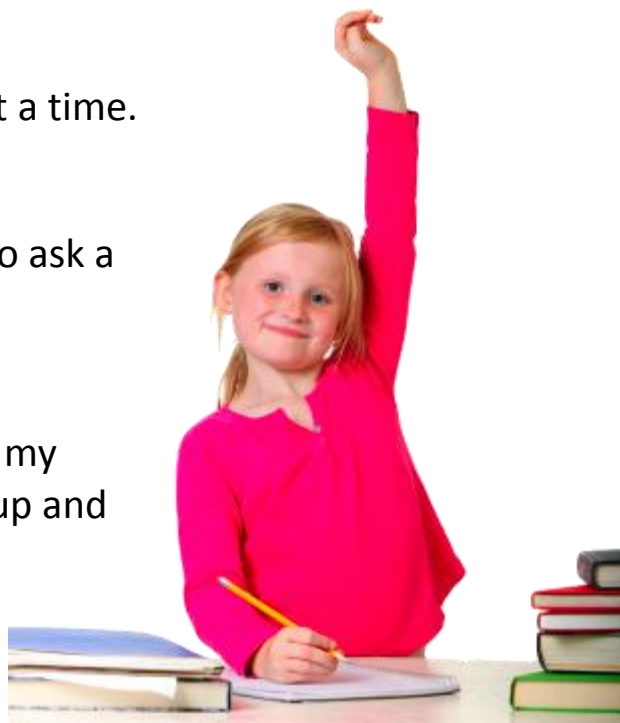
Many times we need to talk one person at a time.
