

## RIDING THE SCHOOL BUS

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I go on the school bus in the morning and afternoons. Buses carry lots of kids and we sit on seats next to each other.

I get on the bus and look at the seats. There are seats on either side of the aisle. There is a row of seats down the back. I look for an empty seat and sit down. I put my bag on my lap and do up my seat belt.



It is important to sit down on the bus. If we stand up the bus driver can't see out the back. Sitting down keeps me safe on the bus.

The bus can get pretty crowded and I might need to sit really close to someone else. That's okay. Sometimes we need to sit close.

Going on the bus is a good way to get to school. I like looking out of the windows to see new things.
